PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome back to the new school year! It was great to see so many parents and students during last week's welcome interviews. It was a fantastic opportunity to set the year up for success, meet teachers, explore lockers, and prepare for a positive year ahead. 2025 Focus

As we begin a new strategic plan, we have three key areas of focus for the year:

1. **Inclusion:** We will be rolling out the new Department of Education Disability Inclusion approach, designed to support all students access education fully.
2. **Collaborative Curriculum Planning:** This focus will strengthen our teaching teams and ensure that our practices align with the recently released Victorian Teaching and Learning Model 2.0, fostering a more unified and effective approach across the school.
3. **Positive Behaviour Supports:** We are introducing the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support approach across the school to further enhance our positive learning environment, ensuring that all students have the opportunity to thrive.

We are excited about these initiatives and look forward to the continued growth and success of our school community.

Working together in 2025

Strong parent-teacher partnerships are essential for supporting student learning and wellbeing, as they foster open communication, shared expectations, and a collaborative approach to addressing student needs. When concerns arise, it is important to follow the appropriate order of inquiry to ensure they are addressed effectively. Parents and carers should first speak with the classroom teacher or subject teacher, who has direct insight into the student's progress and classroom experience. For students in Years 7-12, the next point of contact is the Wellbeing and Engagement Leader (WEL), while for younger students, concerns should be directed to the P-6 Assistant Principal, Gill Hampson. For further support in secondary years, the 7-12 Assistant Principal, Sofia Aleem, is available to assist. If concerns remain unresolved, they can then be brought to the principal. Additionally, the school office staff play a key role in directing parents and carers to the most relevant person, so if unsure, they are a valuable first point of contact. Working together through this process ensures that student needs are met in a timely and effective manner.

School Council Elections

Timboon P-12 School Council election process will be held early this term. I encourage all parents and guardians to carefully consider whether they are interested in contributing to the school by nominating for election to the School Council. The School Council is a legally formed body with the role of supporting key directions of the school within centrally provided guidelines and frameworks.

School Councillors have two-year terms and consequently two vacancies have arisen to fill in 2025. In the event of having more candidates than positions, all parents/guardians of students at Timboon P-12 School are eligible to vote for parent members.

The following timeline will apply for filling of the available school council parent positions in 2025:

Wednesday 12 February Nominations for vacant position open –Parent nomination forms can be collected from the front office.

Wednesday 19 February Nominations close and must be submitted by 4:00pm

Friday 21 February List of candidates and nominators posted. Ballot papers distributed if more candidates than positions.

Friday 28 February Ballot closes at 4pm.

School & Student Insurance Reminder

Parents are reminded that Timboon P-12 School and the Department of Education does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance and/or transport and any other transport costs incurred.

Student accident insurance/ambulance cover policies are available from some commercial insurers and can be obtained by parents or guardians for individual students.

Timboon P-12 School and the Department of Education cannot advise parents or guardians on whether to purchase a student accident policy or ambulance cover, or which policy to purchase. It is recommended that they seek assistance in this matter with their insurance broker or find a suitable personal accident insurer online.

Personal Property

Personal property is often brought to school by students, staff and visitors. This may include mobile phones, iPads, laptops, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. As Timboon P-12 School or the Department of Education and Training does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property; students, staff and visitors are discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school. It is highly recommended parents insure personal property.

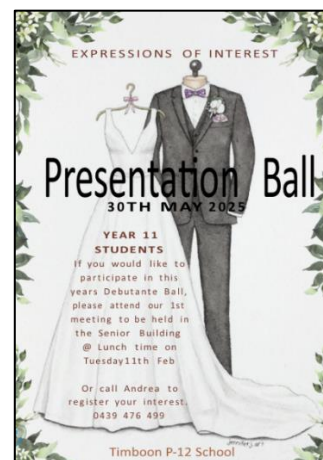

to the Office by 2pm. This allows time for the office staff to contact teachers and communicate changes with children as needed. A written note sent in the morning is ideal. Afternoon pick-up is from the **quadrangle in front of the JS3 (two-story red) building**, not at the classroom door please. This is for the safety of our little ones and also to allow teachers to ensure students head to where they need to go. Driving in the school yard between 8:30am-9:15am and 3:15pm – 3:45pm is **not allowed**. Please park outside the school yard and walk in. If your child arrives late to school, or needs to leave early, please sign them in/out through the office. Students leaving early will be sent to the office by the teacher. This is to save visitors distracting the learning of the class. Library bags are required for all students and must be used to borrow, which is at least weekly with their class. Private music instruction is available at school. Please contact the office if you would like to know more.

Last year, our Parent Payment information was posted on Compass. If you need another copy, please contact the office. Nicki Stockings is our Finance Manager and is happy to work with families to explain the contributions and organise payment plans. Fiona Allan is our First Aid Officer and you are likely to receive phone calls from her if your child is injured or needs to be collected from School. Canteen manager, Cheryl Miller, is eager to hear from those that are willing to volunteer in the café. Every little bit of support goes a long way to keeping our café service running. Breakfast club runs Wednesday mornings (8:30am - 9am) and is free for all students. If you want to assist with this program, please let us know.

Term 1 is busy and **Compass** remains as our main way of communicating home with regards to events, emails and notifications. Please ensure that you have the Compass app on your phone and are able to access it. The best way to keep across dates is to refer to the Compass calendar. Some important dates for your calendar are:

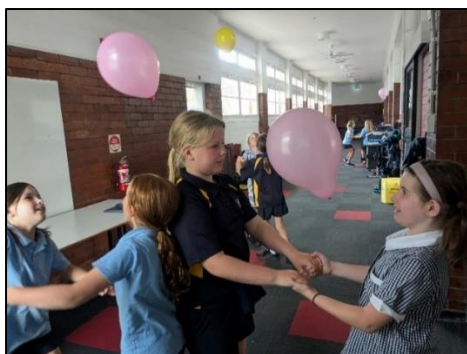

We would like to congratulate all students who have been wearing their hats and have remembered to bring their water bottle each day. Both items are extremely important in the recent hot weather.

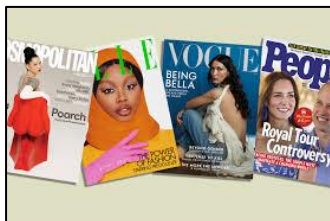


Year 3-4
